God's will is more about a WHO than a DO.

If you want to know God's will, you need to know God's heart.

Three Common Traps

1. We over-spiritualize God's will.

Matthew 12:38-39 (NIV) "Then some of the Pharisees and teachers of the law said to Him, 'Teacher, we want to see a sign from You.' ³⁹ He answered, 'A wicked and adulterous generation asks for a sign! But none will be given it except the sign of the prophet Jonah."

We're asking for an open door when we still have a closed Bible.

James 1:5 (NIV) "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."

Matthew 6:33 (NIV) "But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."

2. We overanalyze God's will.

Hebrews 11:6 (NIV) "And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him."

The more we analyze, the less we obey.

Proverbs 3:5-6 (NIV) "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; ⁶ in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight."

Proverbs 3:6 (NASB) "In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight."

Proverbs 3:6 (KJV) "In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths."

yada: to know deeply, relationally, and experientially

Genesis 4:1 (KJV) "And Adam knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the Lord."

Genesis 4:1a (NIV) "Adam made love to his wife Eve, and she became pregnant and gave birth to Cain."

- 2 Corinthians 5:7 (NIV) "For we live by faith, not by sight."
- 2 Corinthians 5:7 (NASB) "For we walk by faith, not by sight."
- 2 Corinthians 5:7 (KJV) "For we walk by faith, not by sight."

You'll never fulfill your calling if fear gets the final vote.

3. We assume that hard means wrong.

If it's hard, this must not be God's will.

1 Peter 3:17 (NIV) "For it is better, if it is God's will, to suffer for doing good than for doing evil."

You can't walk in God's will if you're disobeying God's Word.

Romans 8:13 (NIV) "For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live."

John 3:30 (NASB) "He must increase, but I must decrease."

John 3:30 (NIV) "He must become greater; I must become less."

Galatians 2:20 (NIV) "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me."

If you're looking for easy, you're not looking for Jesus.
